YONG IN SEASONAL CAMP Q&A

What are the ages of students attending camp?

- Ages vary from 3 years old to 16 years old. While the ages of the children we take care of may vary, we encourage cooperation and respect for others at every opportunity. On field trips we have two groups: one for 3-8 years old and the other for 9 years and up.

Are the children watched over at all times?

- As everyone knows no one can watch every child every second, however our adult to child ratio is 8-10 kids per one adult. Our staff have at least two years of experience in child care and we keep a disciplined environment so the students stay safe. We are constantly walking around and watching them to make sure everyone is being kind and safe.

When there are a lot of kids, how can I be sure that my child will be safe?

- Everyday we advise the children to follow the rules of our Taekwondo. We always look out for one another and treat others how you want to be treated. Same answer as the question above, the staff are constantly walking around patrolling the rooms and hallways. We talk to the children as well and make sure they tell us if anything happens between other kids.

What time is drop off/pick up?

- Students may be dropped off anytime after 6:30am, but if they are planning on going on a field trip please drop them off no later than 9:00am. When picking up your child/children, please pick them up no later than 6:30pm unless their taekwondo class ends at 7:00pm. Please be mindful that our staff starts cleaning at 6:10-6:30pm. If you can't pick up your child by 6:30pm, please call us at 703-313-8804 to let Master Woo know that you will be late OR if someone else will be picking your child up.

When do the students leave for the field trips?

Students must arrive no later than 9:00am as we usually leave by 9:30-10:00am and return around 12:30pm for lunch. There are some cases where we leave after lunch so they must arrive by 11:30am (if they want to have lunch at the taekwondo). If they are going to eat lunch before the trip elsewhere please arrive by 12:15pm.

When does my child need to bring money?

- All field trips are paid for with tuition. The parents/guardians do have to pay for their child/childrens voucher for Six flags. The only time they will need money is for playtime at Chuck E. Cheese, snacks/drinks for the Movie Theatre, snacks/drinks/items for the Korean Market, and lunch/candy/items at Six flags. This is not a requirement, and it is solely up to the parent/guardian. If you would like us to hold onto the money, please hand it to Mrs. Woo or Grace at the front desk.

What kinds of activities are available at camp?

- After we get back from the trips or before we go on the trips we usually play indoor games like dodgeball, ghost in the graveyard, red light/green light, Korean games, arts and crafts, and sometimes we play a movie with a projector in the gym.

Do you provide lunch or snacks?

- We do not provide lunch or snacks. Students must bring their own lunch/snacks. We suggest packing them extra snacks if they are planning to be there for the whole day. We also have a water fountain available.

What if my child forgets and doesn't have lunch that day?

- We will call you if we find that your child did not bring any food. If your child does not have lunch or a snack we may be able to offer them food depending on the circumstances. Your child will eat and be cared for.

What are the rules on bringing items from home?

- Students are allowed to bring devices and toys but they are responsible for their own belongings. We will not be held liable for lost/damaged items. Students are more than welcome to bring anything from home as long as it is appropriate and the parent/guardian approves.

How many classes per week can my child take during camp?

- We offer each student 4 classes a week however, we find that it is most beneficial to take at least 3 classes a week.

If an accident occurs or an emergency happens, what are the procedures for this occurrence?

- If an accident occurs we will contact the parent immediately depending on the severity of the situation. If there is an emergency, the INOVA hospital is located less than 5 minutes away. Parents will be contacted before any emergency action is taken. Staff have their cell phones at all times.
